

**S3 Enterprises Awards Leadership Bursary to Lynnette Giesbrecht of Pambrun, SK.**

For even the son of God did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

The Frank and Helen Rempel Servant Leadership Bursary was established 2 years ago, and is available to local school division students who display leadership qualities and are registered for post secondary education.
